



## Acting on these doable items will reinvigorate the legislative process

## 1. Commit to regular order.

Committees should conduct legislative and oversight hearings, marking-up legislation after receiving input from both sides and issuing committee reports. Members should be allowed to offer amendments to legislation on the floor and full conference committees should be held.

- 2. Pass energy efficiency legislation championed by Senators Jeanne Shaheen (D-NH) and Rob Portman (R-OH) and Representatives David McKinley (R-WV) and Peter Welch (D-VT).
- **3. Advance energy innovation** and reauthorize the National Institute of Standards and Technology.

- **4. Create new bankruptcy authority** specifically designed for the failure of large financial institutions to provide another effective tool for ending bailouts for too-big-to-fail institutions.
- **5. Develop a workforce that can respond to growing cyber threats** by passing legislation that increases training for cyber professions.
- **6. Establish a regulatory oversight framework for health information technology** that promotes innovation and protects patient safety.
- 7. Grant Trade Promotion
  Authority giving the administration
  the freedom to negotiate trade
  agreements with our allies in the
  European Union and the Asia-Pacific
  region.

- **8. Expedite exporting of liquefied natural gas** (LNG) to capitalize on our growing U.S. energy resources and create jobs.
- 9. Improve the technology transfer and commercialization of energy technologies by passing the Department of Energy Laboratory Modernization and Technology Transfer Act.
- 10. Establish a commission to inform better use of data to evaluate the effectiveness of spending on federal programs and tax expenditures, as in the Evidence-Based Policymaking Commission Act of 2014 championed by Senator Patty Murray (D-WA) and Congressman Paul Ryan (R-WI).
