METHODOLOGY

This poll was conducted between February 4-6, 2022 among a national sample of 2,209 adults. The interviews were conducted online and the data were weighted to approximate a target sample of adults based on gender, educational attainment, age, race, and region. Results from the full survey have a margin of error of \pm 0, results among women (n=1,143) have a margin of error of \pm 0, and results among moms (n=302) have a margin of error of \pm 0.

What We Found To Be True From The Recent Data From Moms

Of moms have personally experienced pregnancy discrimination in the workplace.

Of moms have been scared to tell an employer about a pregnancy for fear of discrimination of retaliation.

What We Found To Be True From The Recent Data From Adults


Of parents say their current or former spouse/partner has experienced pregnancy discrimination in the workplace.

Of adults have personally witnessed pregnancy discrimination in the workplace, including 18% of millennial adults.

About a tenth (8%) of women have personally experienced pregnancy discrimination in the workplace.










Adults with a higher level of income are more likely to say their current or former spouse/partner has experienced pregnancy discrimination in the workplace.

Urban adults (10%) are more likely than suburban (3%) and rural (3%) adults to say their current or former spouse/partner has experienced pregnancy discrimination in the workplace.






Dads are five times more likely than moms (23% vs. 4%) to say their current or former spouse/partner has experienced pregnancy discrimination in the workplace.






Younger adults are more likely than older adults to say they have personally witnessed pregnancy discrimination in the workplace.

Urban adults (17%) are more likely than suburban (10%) and rural adults (9%) to say they have personally witnessed pregnancy discrimination in the workplace.


Have you ever personally witnessed pregnancy discrimination in the workplace?





Parents are twice as likely as adults who are not parents (20% vs. 9%) to say they have personally witnessed pregnancy discrimination in the workplace.




A tenth of women (9%) have personally been scared to tell an employer about a pregnancy for fear of discrimination or retaliation.



Fifteen percent of millennial women have personally been scared to tell an employer about a pregnancy for fear of discrimination or retaliation.






About a quarter of moms (23%) have thought about leaving a job due to a lack of reasonable accommodation or fear of discrimination from an employer during pregnancy.
