Data lost by Revenue and Customs

HM Revenue and Customs (HMRC) has lost computer disks containing confidential details of 25 million child benefit recipients.

The organisation says it does not believe the records - names, addresses, dates of birth and bank accounts - have fallen into the wrong hands. This is not the first time it has lost sensitive information.

The information, which dates back 10 years, was mislaid somewhere between London and Sandown Health Centre on the Isle of Wight.

It was given to courier company City Link in March, but the health centre only spotted it was missing in May.

A spokesman for the South Central Strategic Health Authority said the courier company - which is supposed to track every item at every stage - demonstrated a "clear failure" by losing all record of the disc once it passed into their hands.

City Link, which won "Courier of the Year" last year for reliability and customer service, is searching all its 92 depots nationwide, while all

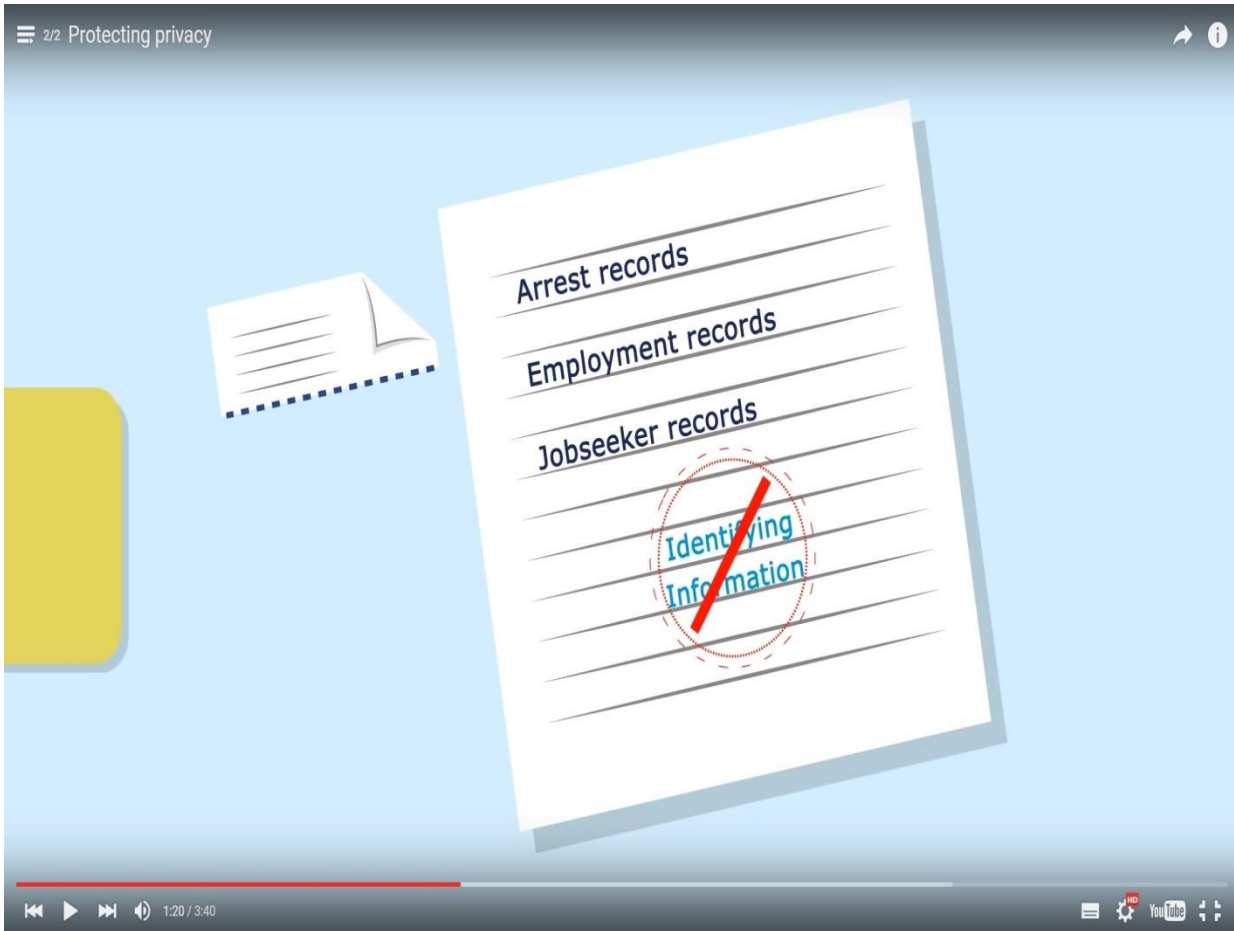
