Crosstabulation Results

Methodology:

This poll was conducted between December 11-December 16, 2020 among a national sample of 1500 Parents. The interviews were conducted online and the data were weighted to approximate a target sample of Parents based on age, gender, educational attainment, race, and region. Results from the full survey have a margin of error of plus or minus 3 percentage points.
