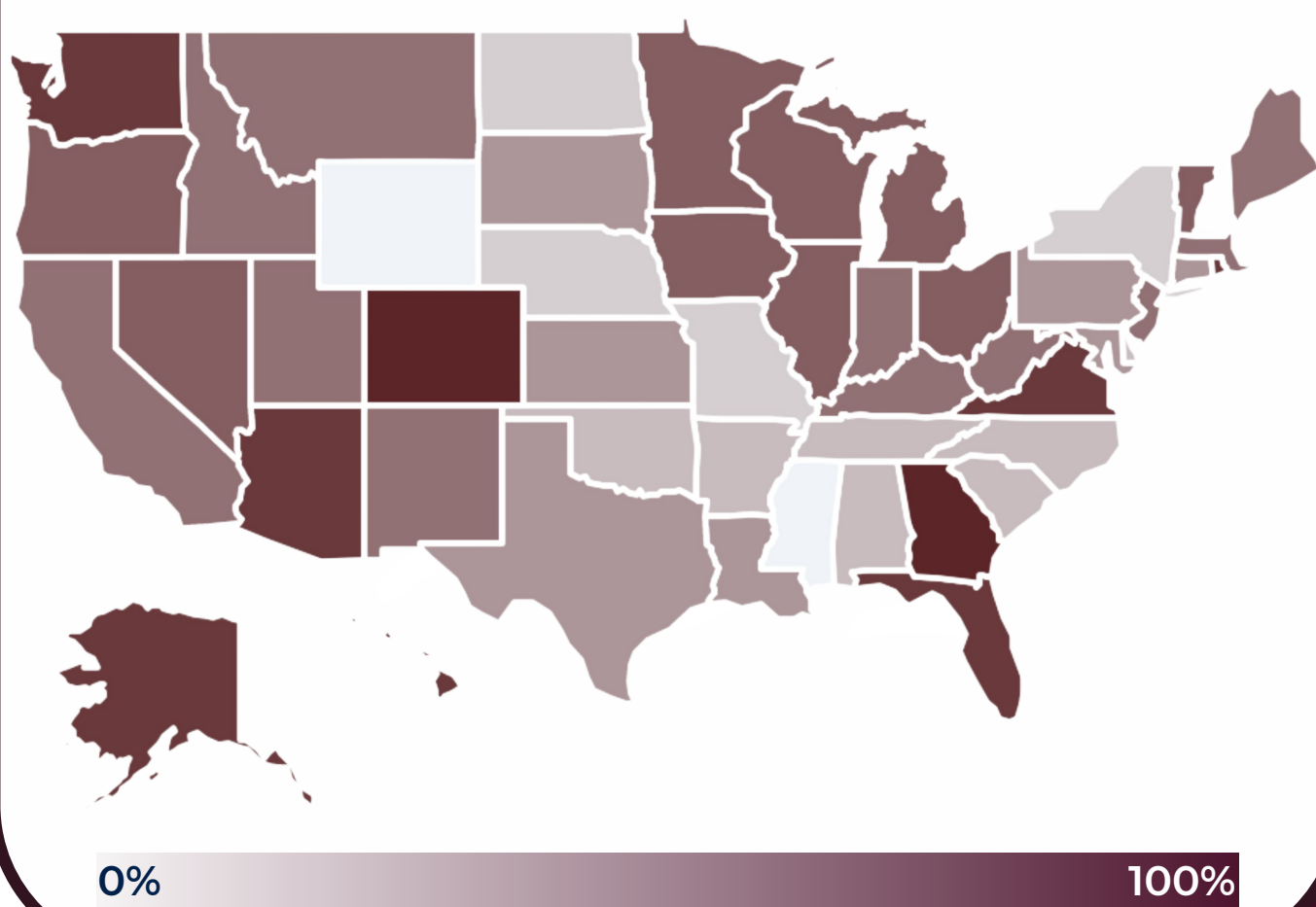

### HOW IT WORKS

Our framework proposes 12 incentive-based minimum standards. States who meet all the standards would receive additional federal funding to fill existing gaps in necessary resources to run elections.

## CURRENT UPTAKE BY STATES

*Our proposed minimum standards have already been implemented to varying degrees in states across the country. The below chart shows the % of recommendations met by each state.*
