







10 Things to Know About Alaska's Child Care Workforce


Forty-six child care workforce registries across the country collect comprehensive data on their state's workforce. This report is a first-of-its-kind snapshot of child care workforce data collected by registries across the country. This is just a small slice of the capabilities of registries, many of which collect data to even greater levels of detail.

ALASKA'S DATA

The data included here is from the Alaska System for Early Education Development (SEED) as of January 11, 2024. The data includes those who work in programs participating in Learn & Grow and state-funded scholarship. Participation in the registry for all other workforce members is voluntary. Alaska estimates their total ECE workforce size to be 6,900. This report reflects data from 1,632 active registry members working in direct care positions, inclusive of trainers and coaches. 

4. Employment Status¹






