


There are **396,960** children under age 5 in Arizona, comprising **5%** of the state's total population. An additional **11%** of the state's population, approximately **798,471** children, are between the ages of 5 and 13.



**296,800** children under 5 with a potential need for formal child care



**256,420** formal child care spots in licensed registered programs



**48,920** children left without a formal child care spot

Arizona is at risk of losing between

**\$2,497,822,601 - \$3,815,722,682**

in lost household income, decreased business productivity, and forgone tax revenue over the next 10 years due to the **16.50%** child care gap.

### CCDF Eligibility

Income  $\leq$  85% SMI

A household of three qualifies for CCDF subsidy if their monthly income is at or below **\$3,419**

### Head Start Eligibility

Income  $\leq$  100% FPL

A household of three qualifies for Head Start if their annual income is at or below **\$26,650**
