

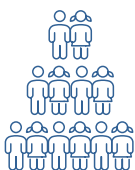
There are **170,528** children under age 5 in Nevada, comprising **5%** of the state's total population. An additional **11%** of the state's population, approximately **349,537** children, are between the ages of 5 and 13.

CCDF Eligibility

Income $\leq$ 41% SMI

A household of three qualifies for CCDF subsidy if their monthly income is at or below **\$2,756**

Head Start Eligibility

Income $\leq$ 100% FPL

A household of three qualifies for Head Start if their annual income is at or below **\$26,650**
