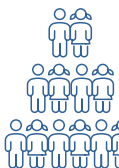
There are **663,930** children under age 5 in Pennsylvania, comprising **5%** of the state's total population. An additional **10%** of the state's population, approximately **1,326,633** children, are between the ages of 5 and 13.



558,790 children under 5 with a potential need for formal child care



411,470 formal child care spots in licensed registered programs



154,690 children left without a formal child care spot

Pennsylvania is at risk of losing between

\$7,415,588,728 - \$11,287,123,912

in lost household income, decreased business productivity, and forgone tax revenue over the next 10 years due to the **27.70%** child care gap.

CCDF Eligibility

Income $\leq$ 55% SMI

A household of three qualifies for CCDF subsidy if their monthly income is at or below **\$4,303**

Head Start Eligibility

Income $\leq$ 100% FPL

A household of three qualifies for Head Start if their annual income is at or below **\$26,650**
